WIC: Women, Infants and Children

Racine Kenosha Community Action Agency runs WIC which provides:

- Checks to buy foods that help keep your family healthy
- Nutrition information and breastfeeding information
- Health and diet assessments; nutrition counseling
- Hemoglobin (Iron) and blood lead testing; monitor growth (weight and height) of children
- Information and referrals to other community resources
